

FLORIDIANS OVERWHELMINGLY SUPPORT FARMERS' ACCESS TO CROP PROTECTION TOOLS

The public has major concerns about the growing impact of litigation on food security and inflation

Modern Aq Alliance's inaugural sentiment survey confirms that Floridians strongly support maintaining farmers' access to critical crop protection products like glyphosate. This support extends across party lines, with majorities of Republicans and Democrats siding with farmers on nearly every question asked. Trial lawyers, who are driving American agriculture toward a crisis by attacking farmers' tools, have extremely low levels of trust among Floridians. Meanwhile, farmers enjoy high levels of public trust.

KEY SURVEY FINDINGS:

Floridians oppose litigation that could limit farmers' access to critical crop protection tools

82% of farmers and 61% of all Floridians, including 59% of Republicans and 60% of Democrats, oppose litigation that could limit access to crop protection products.

82% of farmers and 73% of all Floridians, including 71% of Republicans and 78% of Democrats, support science-based policies for crop protection tools.

Florida farmers overwhelmingly depend on crop protection tools to stay competitive

80% of farmers say crop protection products prevent crop loss and that restrictions on these tools would negatively impact their farms.

86% of farmers say pesticides make farming less expensive.

In Florida, people trust farmers, not trial lawyers

67% of Floridians trust local farmers, including 74% of Republicans and 68% of Democrats.

Only 14% of Floridians trust trial lawyers, including 14% of Republicans and 16% of Democrats.

Floridians are deeply concerned that litigation will undermine domestic agricultural supply chains and U.S. food security

90% of farmers and 66% of all Floridians, including 70% of Republicans and 69% of Democrats, worry that litigation will increase U.S. reliance on foreign suppliers, threatening U.S. food security.

Serious concern exists that litigation attacks on crop protection tools will result in higher food prices

82% of farmers and 74% of all Floridians, including 74% of Republicans and 87% of Democrats, are concerned that litigation will lead to lower crop yields and higher food prices.

Floridians want leaders who stand with farmers over trial lawvers

96% of farmers and 80% of all Floridians, including 82% of Republicans and 85% of Democrats, are more likely to support leaders who stand with farmers over trial lawyers.

Methodology: This survey was written and administered by Penta Group Intelligence, an independent research firm. The results are based on a representative sample of 500 online and phone interviews of Florida-based adults and 50 Floridian farmers. The study also surveyed a national representative sample of 1,005 US adults and 550 additional farmers from 11 states. The study was conducted January 29 through February 18, 2025. The margin of error for the Florida adult population is +/-4.38.
