

MISSOURIANS OVERWHELMINGLY SUPPORT FARMERS' ACCESS TO CROP PROTECTION TOOLS

The public has major concerns about the growing impact of litigation on food security and inflation

Modern Aq Alliance's inaugural sentiment survey confirms that Missourians strongly support maintaining farmers' access to critical crop protection products like glyphosate. This support extends across party lines, with majorities of Republicans and Democrats siding with farmers on nearly every question asked. Trial lawyers, who are driving American agriculture toward a crisis by attacking farmers' tools, have extremely low levels of trust among Missourians. Meanwhile, farmers enjoy high levels of public trust.

KEY SURVEY FINDINGS:

Missourians strongly oppose litigation that could limit farmers' access to critical crop protection tools

96% of farmers and 69% of all Missourians, including 73% of Republicans and 67% of Democrats, oppose litigation that could limit access to crop protection products.

90% of farmers and 81% of all Missourians, including 82% of Republicans and 84% of Democrats, support science-based policies for crop protection tools.

Missouri farmers overwhelmingly depend on crop protection tools to stay competitive

96% of farmers say crop protection products prevent crop loss and that restrictions on these tools would negatively impact their farms.

92% of farmers say pesticides make farming less expensive.

In Missouri, people trust farmers, not trial lawyers

77% of Missourians trust local farmers, including 80% of Republicans and 74% of Democrats.

Only 17% of Missourians trust trial lawyers, including 16% of Republicans and 20% of Democrats.

Missourians are deeply concerned that litigation will undermine domestic agricultural supply chains and U.S. food security

84% of farmers and 71% of all Missourians, including 78% of Republicans and 66% of Democrats, worry that litigation will increase U.S. reliance on foreign suppliers, threatening U.S. food security.

Serious concern exists that litigation attacks on crop protection tools will result in higher food prices

90% of farmers and 75% of all Missourians, including 79% of Republicans and 75% of Democrats, are concerned that litigation will lead to lower crop yields and higher food prices.

Missourians want leaders who stand with farmers over trial lawvers

98% of farmers and 86% of all Missourians, including 90% of Republicans and 85% of Democrats, are more likely to support leaders who stand with farmers over trial lawyers.

Methodology: This survey was written and administered by Penta Group Intelligence, an independent research firm. The results are based on a representative sample of 500 online and phone interviews of Missouri-based adults and 50 Missouri farmers. The study also surveyed a national representative sample of 1,005 US adults and 550 additional farmers from 11 states. The study was conducted January 29 through February 18, 2025. The margin of error for the Missouri adult population is +/-4.38.
