



OKLAHOMANS OVERWHELMINGLY SUPPORT FARMERS' ACCESS TO CROP PROTECTION TOOLS

The public has major concerns about the growing impact of litigation on food security and inflation

Modern Ag Alliance's inaugural sentiment survey confirms that Oklahomans strongly support maintaining farmers' access to critical crop protection products like glyphosate. This support extends across party lines, with majorities of Republicans and Democrats siding with farmers on nearly every question asked. Trial lawyers, who are driving American agriculture toward a crisis by attacking farmers' tools, have extremely low levels of trust among Oklahomans. Meanwhile, farmers enjoy high levels of public trust.

KEY SURVEY FINDINGS:

Oklahomans strongly oppose litigation that could limit farmers' access to critical crop protection tools

94% of farmers and **66%** of all Oklahomans, including 69% of Republicans and 69% of Democrats, oppose litigation that could limit access to crop protection products.

96% of farmers and **78%** of all Oklahomans, including 80% of Republicans and 82% of Democrats, support science-based policies for crop protection tools.

Oklahoma farmers overwhelmingly depend on crop protection tools to stay competitive

98% of farmers say crop protection products prevent crop loss and that restrictions on these tools would negatively impact their farms.

82% of farmers say pesticides make farming less expensive.

In Oklahoma, people trust farmers, not trial lawyers

76% of Oklahomans trust local farmers, including 82% of Republicans and 68% of Democrats.

Only **11%** of Oklahomans trust trial lawyers, including 12% of Republicans and 10% of Democrats.

Oklahomans are deeply concerned that litigation will undermine domestic agricultural supply chains and U.S. food security

90% of farmers and **72%** of all Oklahomans, including 72% of Republicans and 67% of Democrats, worry that litigation will increase U.S. reliance on foreign suppliers, threatening U.S. food security.

Serious concern exists that litigation attacks on crop protection tools will result in higher food prices

92% of farmers and **70%** of all Oklahomans, including 74% of Republicans and 69% of Democrats, are concerned that litigation will lead to lower crop yields and higher food prices.

Oklahomans want leaders who stand with farmers over trial lawyers

98% of farmers and **85%** of all Oklahomans, including 88% of Republicans and 84% of Democrats, are more likely to support leaders who stand with farmers over trial lawyers.

Methodology: This survey was written and administered by Penta Group Intelligence, an independent research firm. The results are based on a representative sample of 500 online and phone interviews of Oklahoma-based adults and 50 Oklahoman farmers. The study also surveyed a national representative sample of 1,005 US adults and 550 additional farmers from 11 states. The study was conducted January 29 through February 18, 2025. The margin of error for the Oklahoma adult population is +/-4.38.
